Background

The courses offered by Family Enrichment make use of the case-study method, which is commonly found in business- and law-school classrooms. The case studies center the discussion of each class on real situations with which participants can identify. They are rich in complex family situations that help bring to the forefront various aspects within the life of the family that are essential for proper, productive relationships among family members: husband and wife, parents and children, sibling relationships, immediate family with extended family and friends.

Throughout the course, participants will learn the case-study method and how to apply it to family life.

While the case studies are instructive, it is the wisdom brought to bear on them from the experience of the participating couples, crystallized in the general session by a professional moderator, that often provides the greatest insights.

Mission


Family Enrichment is a not-for-profit organization dedicated to the support of the family as the natural environment for the children's education and promotes the exchange of family experiences.
