Our presenter, Susan Hanssen, Ph.D., is the Associate Professor and Chair of History at the University of Dallas, a small, Catholic, liberal arts college. For 20 years she has taught American Civilization on their Dallas campus during the regular school year and Western Civilization on their Rome campus in the summer. She received her PhD in British and American history from Rice University in Houston. She has been interviewed by Tucker Carlson on Fox News about bias in the AP United States History curriculum, Sky News on race riots in Dallas, and EWTN on the Canonization of St. John Henry Newman.
